Owr Roots Run Deep About Our Theme

Our theme for Hope Blossoms 2021 is "Our Roots Run Deep" - representing our 160-year history of supporting vulnerable mothers and their children in the Washington D.C. region. Throughout our sixteen decades, there have been many "roots" which have helped us to grow and fulfill our mission.

Our very founding was rooted in the conviction of the Daughters of Charity to care for orphans and pregnant women in crisis. Their conviction became a mission, and in 1860 three Daughters of Charity sisters founded our first care center in Washington, D.C. Three years later, this mission was confirmed and expanded when President Abraham Lincoln signed an Act of Congress incorporating us as St. Ann's Infant Asylum, as we were then called.

The tradition of care that began during the Civil War served to define and re-define St. Ann's Center through the momentous historical events of the 20th Century, including two World Wars, the 1918 Flu Pandemic, and the Great Depression.

Our strong roots also allowed us to branch out and adapt as the D.C. region itself grew and expanded. In recent decades, St. Ann's Center shifted from primarily caring for children to supporting vulnerable young mothers and their children on their journey toward stability.

From our founding to the present day, our roots have also run deep amongst friends and benefactors. In times of challenge and in times of plenty, St. Ann's Center benefactors consistently support our work and keep alive the mission of our 19th-Century founders. You continue to sustain both our facilities and programs while also directly impacting the lives of our individual mothers and children who call St. Ann's Center home.

In short, you help us continue to grow. Without you, our work is not possible. Thank you.

Master of Ceremonies



Michael Steele

When he was elected Lieutenant Governor of Maryland in 2003, Michael Steele made history as the first African American elected to statewide office. As chairman of the Republican National Committee, Michael Steele was charged with revitalizing the Republican Party. A self-described "Lincoln Republican," under Steele's leadership the RNC broke fundraising records.

As Lt. Governor of Maryland, Mr. Steele's priorities included reforming the state's Minority Business Enterprise program, improving the quality of Maryland's public education system, expanding economic development in the state and fostering cooperation between government and faith-based organizations to help those in need.

Mr. Steele's abilities as a communicator and commentator have been showcased through his current role as a political analyst for MSNBC. He has appeared on Meet the Press, Face the Nation, HBO's Real Time with Bill Maher, Comedy Central's The Colbert Report and The Daily Show. In addition to his work in television, Mr. Steele co-hosted the daily radio program, Steele & Ungar on the POTUS Channel on SiriusXM and is the host of the podcast The Michael Steele Podcast.

Born at Andrews Air Force Base in Prince George's County, Maryland, Mr. Steele was raised in Washington, DC. Upon graduating from Johns Hopkins University ('81), he entered the Order of St. Augustine where he studied for the priesthood. He is a graduate of Georgetown Law Center ('91), an Aspen Institute Rodel Fellow in Public Leadership and a University of Chicago Institute of Politics Fellow. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of Catholic Charities, Archdiocese of Washington.

THE AWARD

The Mary McGrory Advocacy Award was inaugurated at our 150th Anniversary Gala in honor of its namesake, a passionate advocate and dear friend to St. Ann's, whom our children lovingly called "Mary Gloria." This award recognizes individuals whose work brings attention to the needs of some of the community's voiceless: homeless and vulnerable youth and young mothers.

THE HONOREES

In 1860, three members of the Daughters of Charity – Sister Dionysia O'Keefe, Sister Catherine Reddy, and Sister Sienna Harty – founded St. Ann's Center in response to the need for care for infants and single mothers in the nation's capital. Three years later, President Abraham Lincoln signed an Act of Congress incorporating St. Ann's Infant Asylum, as we were then known.

The Daughters of Charity guided St. Ann's through momentous historical events including two World Wars, the 1918 Flu Pandemic, and the Great Depression. As D.C. itself grew and expanded, the Daughters adapted St. Ann's focus from primarily caring for children to supporting vulnerable young mothers and their children on their journey toward stability.

The Daughters' innovations include the creation of our day care center (1949), a children's emergency residential care center (1975), a respite care program for handicapped children (1977), infant day care (1984), St. Ann's High School (1993), and the establishment of Faith House (1996), Hope House (2013), our Food Pantry (2016) and our ESL Program (2017).

160 years since our founding, the Daughters of Charity continue to lead and influence St. Ann's mission of supporting our young families on their journey towards healing and independence.

THE AWARD

The Michele Heidenberger Volunteer Award is named in honor of a long-serving and devoted St. Ann's volunteer. Michele, an American Airlines flight attendant, was tragically taken from us in the crash at the Pentagon on September 11th, 2001. We honor her memory and years of dedicated service by presenting this award to an individual or group whose volunteerism has had a significant impact on vulnerable women and children.

THE HONOREES

Miguel Coppedge is a D.C. high school student, advocate, volunteer, and philanthropist who by age 10 became a best-selling author of three books: "The Adventures of Fireman," "The Case of The Stinger" (sequel to first book) and "Friendly Officers." Miguel donates a portion of his book sale proceeds to St. Ann's Center, where he resided as a foster baby awaiting adoption into his loving family. Today Miguel is a entrepreneur and inspirational speaker who has been honored by numerous media for his work promoting reading at D.C.-area schools, daycares, and after school programs. Miguel continues to give back to St. Ann's, organizing book drives, coat drives, and holiday gift drives for St. Ann's families.

Jake Garner is a high school student in Stafford County, VA. When he was just eight years old, Jake decided he wanted to support St. Ann's Center by giving up his birthday gifts to raise funds for our housing programs. Jake's early passion for helping others through St. Ann's has turned into a years-long legacy of supporting our food bank, helping fund-raise, and shopping for St. Ann's families during the holidays. In his spare time, Jake pursues his passion for theater arts through his role as Prop Master at the Mountain View High School Theatre Department.


